

Why register with Faculty of 1000?

If you have access to Faculty of 1000 (F1000), take full advantage of the service by registering. Registering with F1000.com enables you to **personalize the site with MyF1000**.

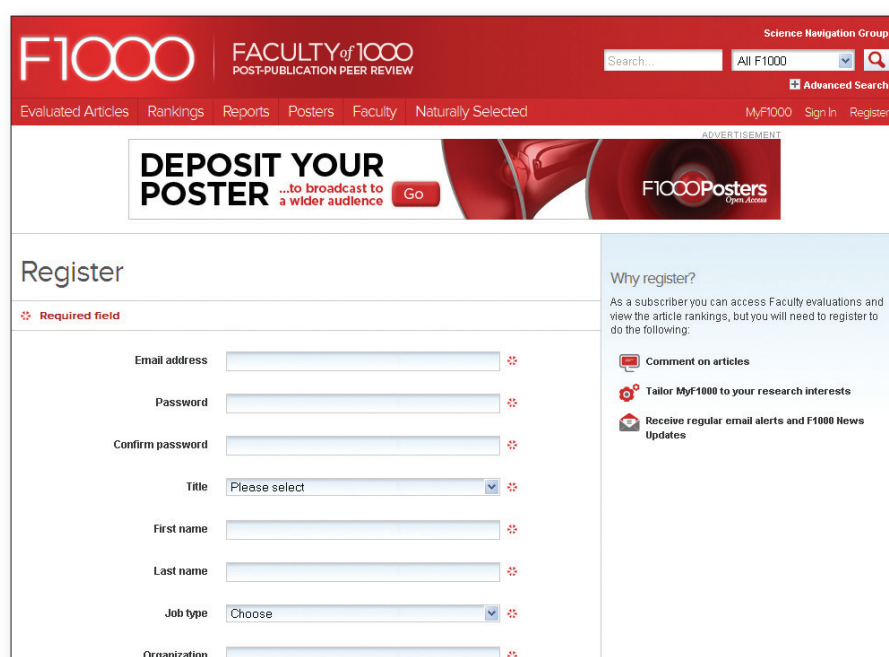
If you are a subscriber or have free trial access you can:

- > Select and store your favorite F1000 Sections (areas of interest)
- > Opt to receive email alerts informing you of the newly evaluated articles in your chosen Sections
- > Receive the F1000 Monthly Update email

In addition, if you are a subscriber you can:

- > Join the F1000 community: comment on evaluations

How to register:

1 My Sections

Recent evaluated articles from your favorite Sections:

Once you have logged in to MyF1000, click on the 'Edit Sections' link on the right side of the page to select your areas of interest from the drop down menus. Click 'Update' at the bottom of the page to save these changes.

My Email Alerts

Customizable email alerts

Click on the 'My Email Alerts' link on the left hand menu or 'Edit Email Alerts' on the right hand side of the page to edit your email preferences.

Here you can set up the email alerts based on the areas of interest you select. You can amend the frequency and number of articles you receive in the drop down menus, and opt-in to receive the F1000 Monthly Update.

2 My Saved Articles

Save evaluations and access them later

Search F1000 evaluations as normal. Click the 'Add to MyF1000' link on the right hand menu within the evaluation (you will need to be logged in to do this). You can access the saved article at any time by logging in and scrolling down the page to 'My Saved Articles'.

3 My Stored Searches

Store search terms and opt-in to receive email alerts

Search F1000 with any keywords, as normal. At the top of the page where the results are listed there is a link to 'Store search'. Follow the link to store the search under any name (you will need to be logged in to MyF1000 to do this).

You can view your stored searches by logging in to MyF1000 and scrolling down the page to 'My Stored Searches'. To the left of this area there is a link to 'Edit Email Alerts' where you can edit your email alert preferences by frequency and number of articles for both stored searches and section alerts.

4 My Comments (subscribers only)

Quick access to your comments on articles

You will need to be logged in to comment on evaluated articles. Once you have logged in, go to the article you wish to comment on. Click on 'Comment on this article' on the left hand side of the page. Type your comment in the box that appears from the drop down menu, select your status and click 'Submit'.

You can view any comments you have made by logging in to MyF1000 and scrolling down the page to 'My Comments'.
