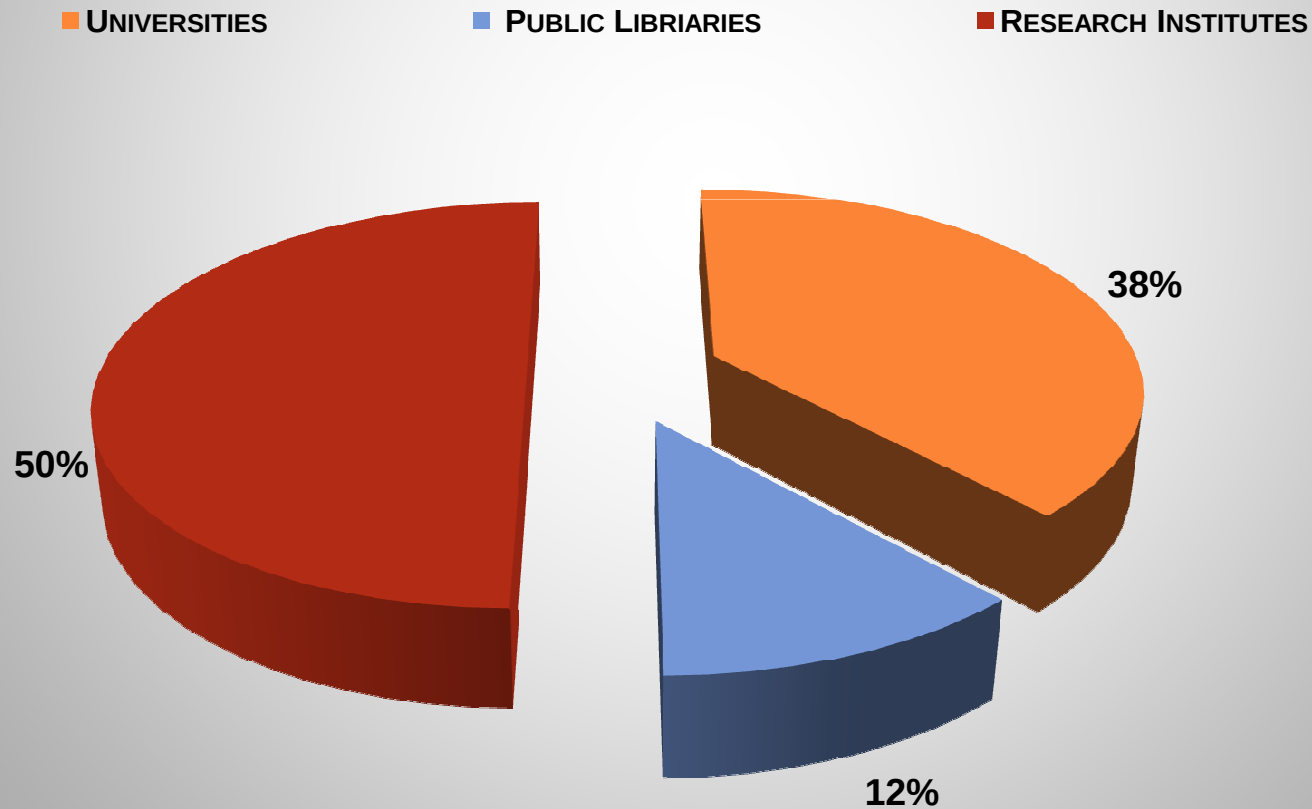

# Not-for-profit Partnership National Electronic-Information Consortium NEICON

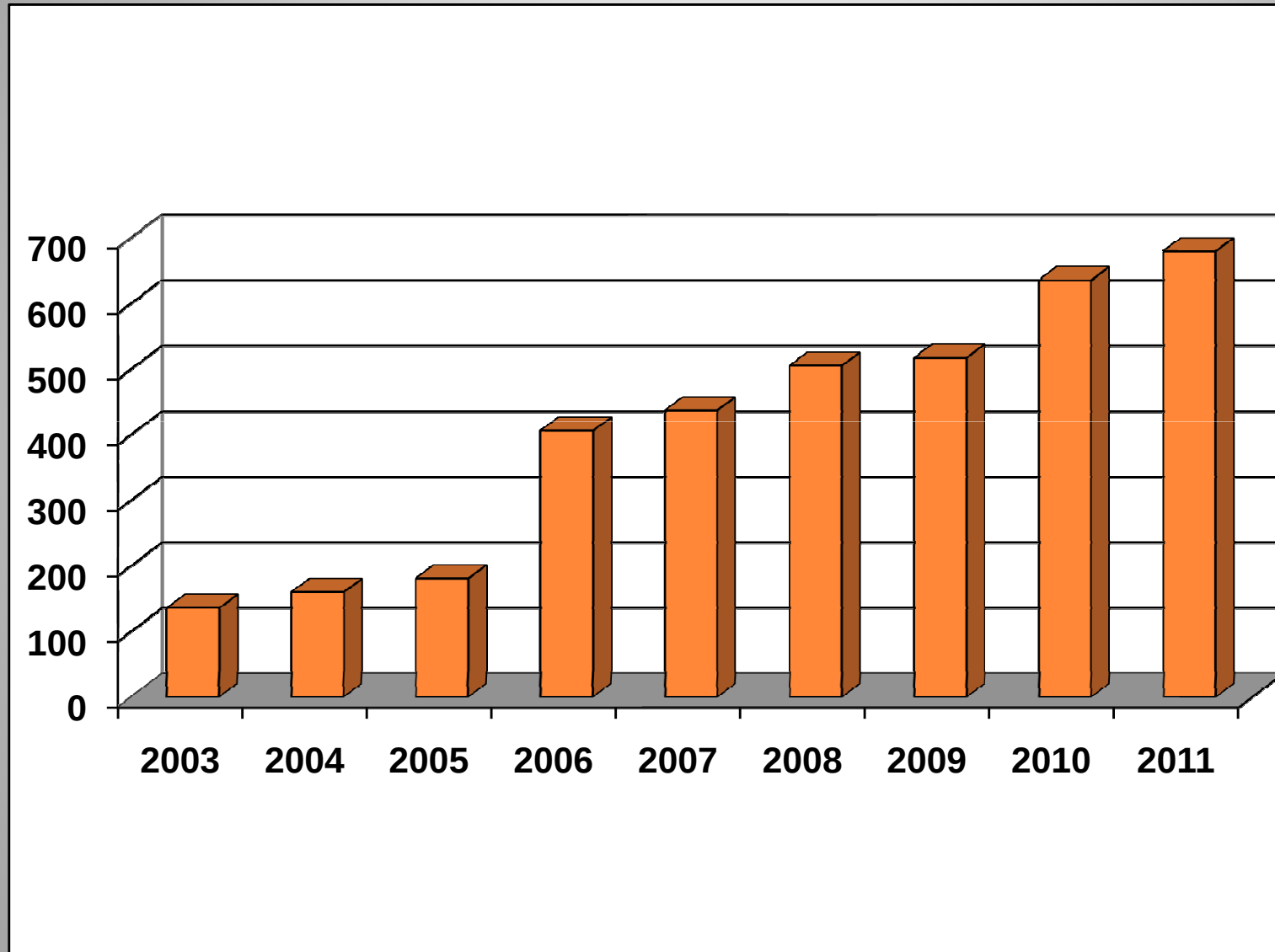
- ◉ Founded in 2002.
- ◉ Key Founders: Russian State Library and National Library of Russia.
- ◉ Main activity: provision access to scholarly resources.
- ◉ Comprises more than 700 not-for-profit Russian institutions.
- ◉ Has signed license agreements with more than 50 publishers and provides access to hundreds of databases.

## 2 Federal Target Programs “FTP” in 2008–2011

- ◉ 26 different resources have been selected and subscribed during this period. More than 11 000 applications have been considered.
- ◉ Over 7000 site licenses have been paid.
- ◉ And 11 000 site licenses have been executed.
- ◉ Almost 470 organizations have got access. They make about 4 million downloads yearly.
- ◉ Subscription fees make more than 90% of contract funds.

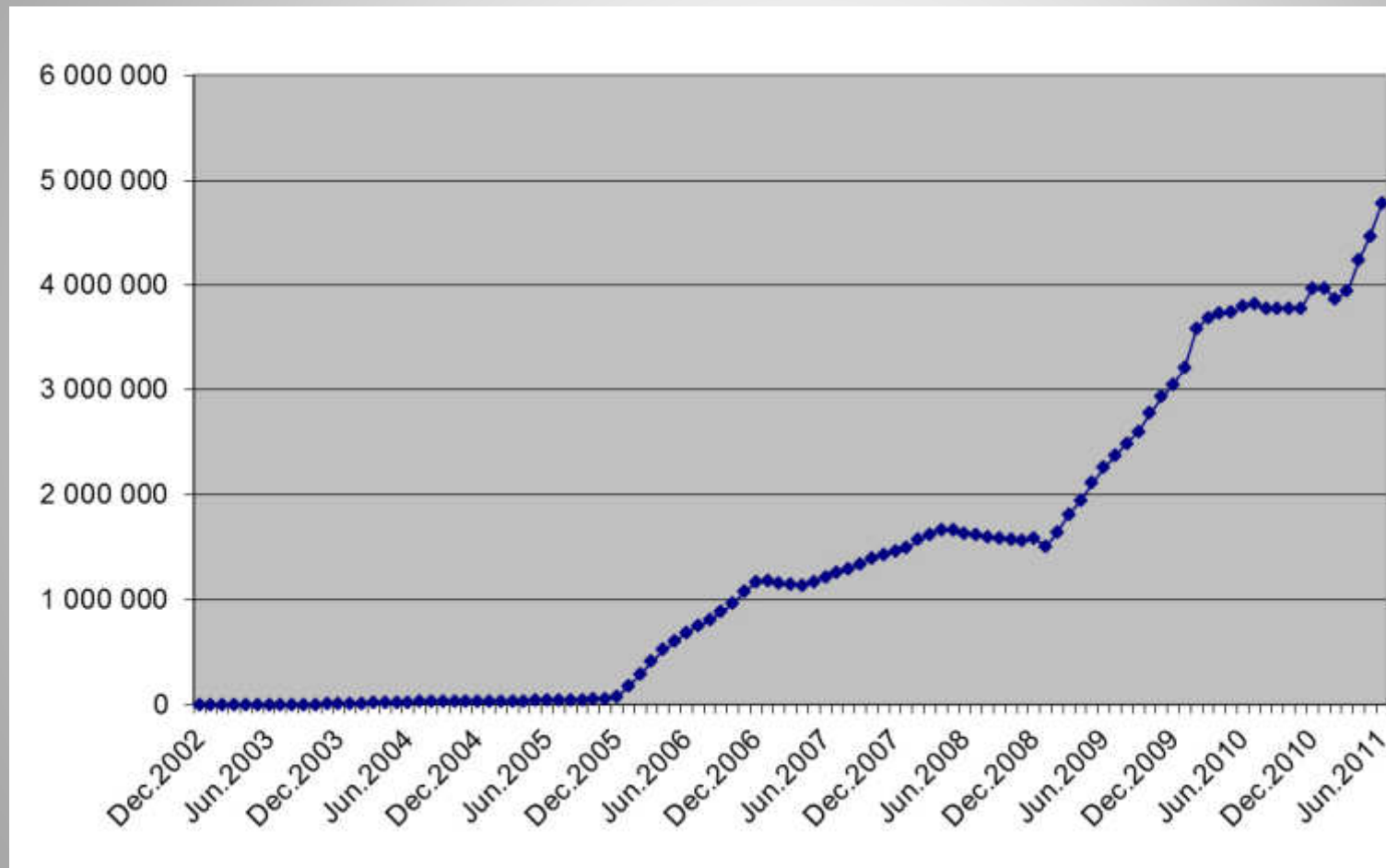
## How we select resources for subscription within the “FTP’s”

- ◉ We analyze the publication flow represented in citation indices Web of Science or Scopus.
- ◉ Experts from academic and research community together with IT-specialists make a selection.
- ◉ Results of the selection are approved by the Ministry of Education & Science.
- ◉ More than hundred databases have been analyzed in total.

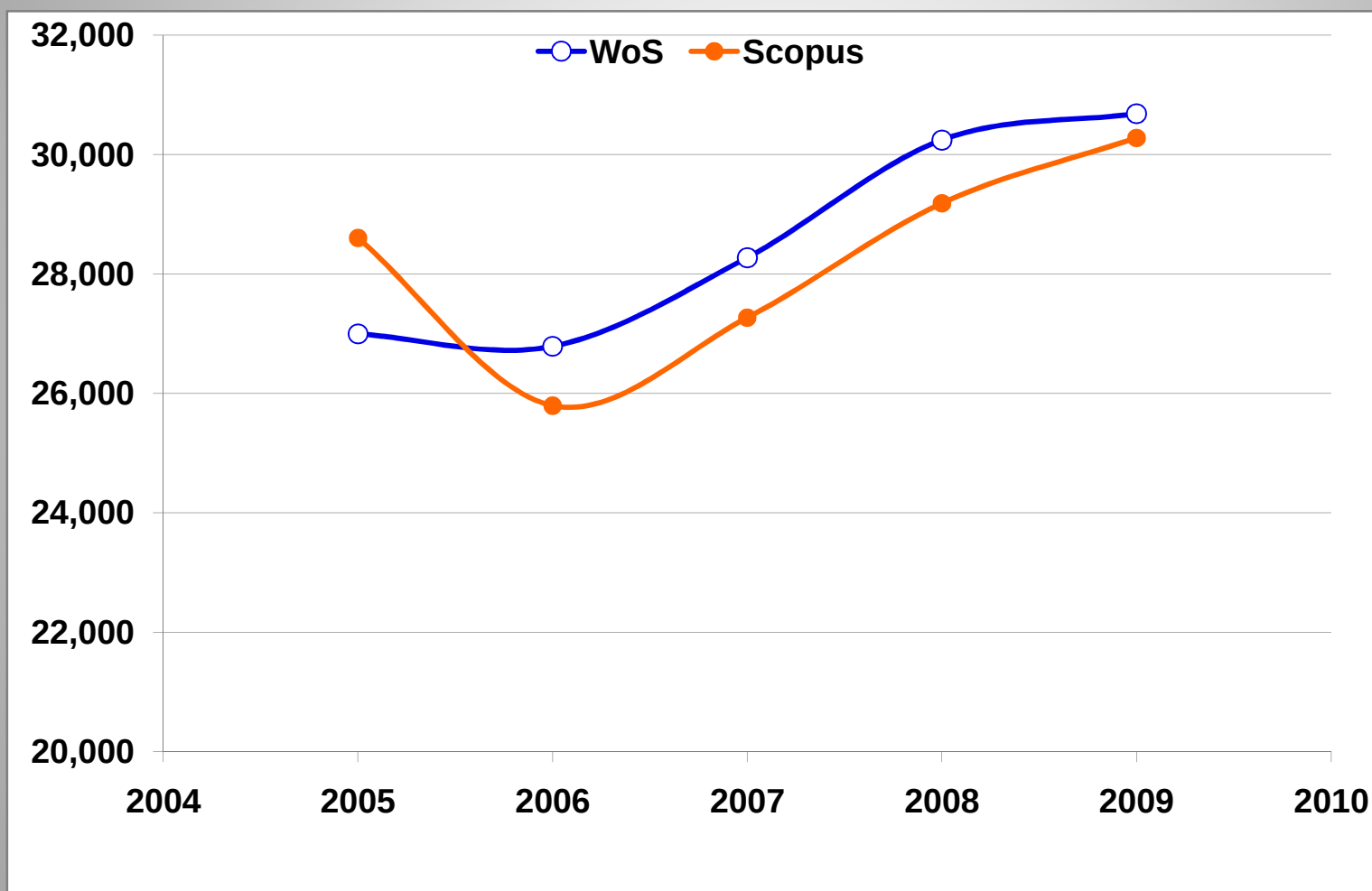
## Annual usage of electronic resources by NEICON members (within FTP)



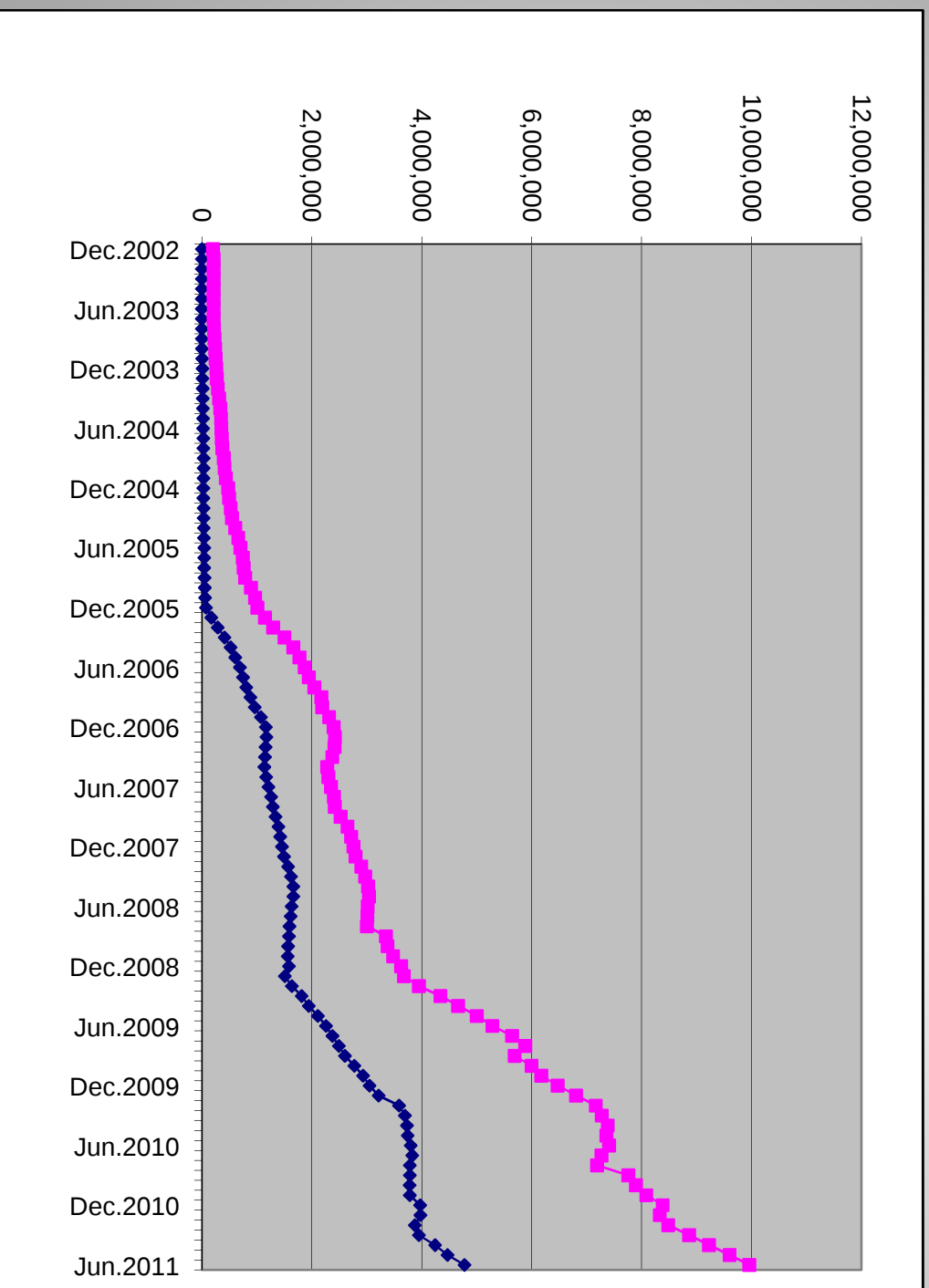

## Dynamics of the number of Russian publications in Scopus and WoS



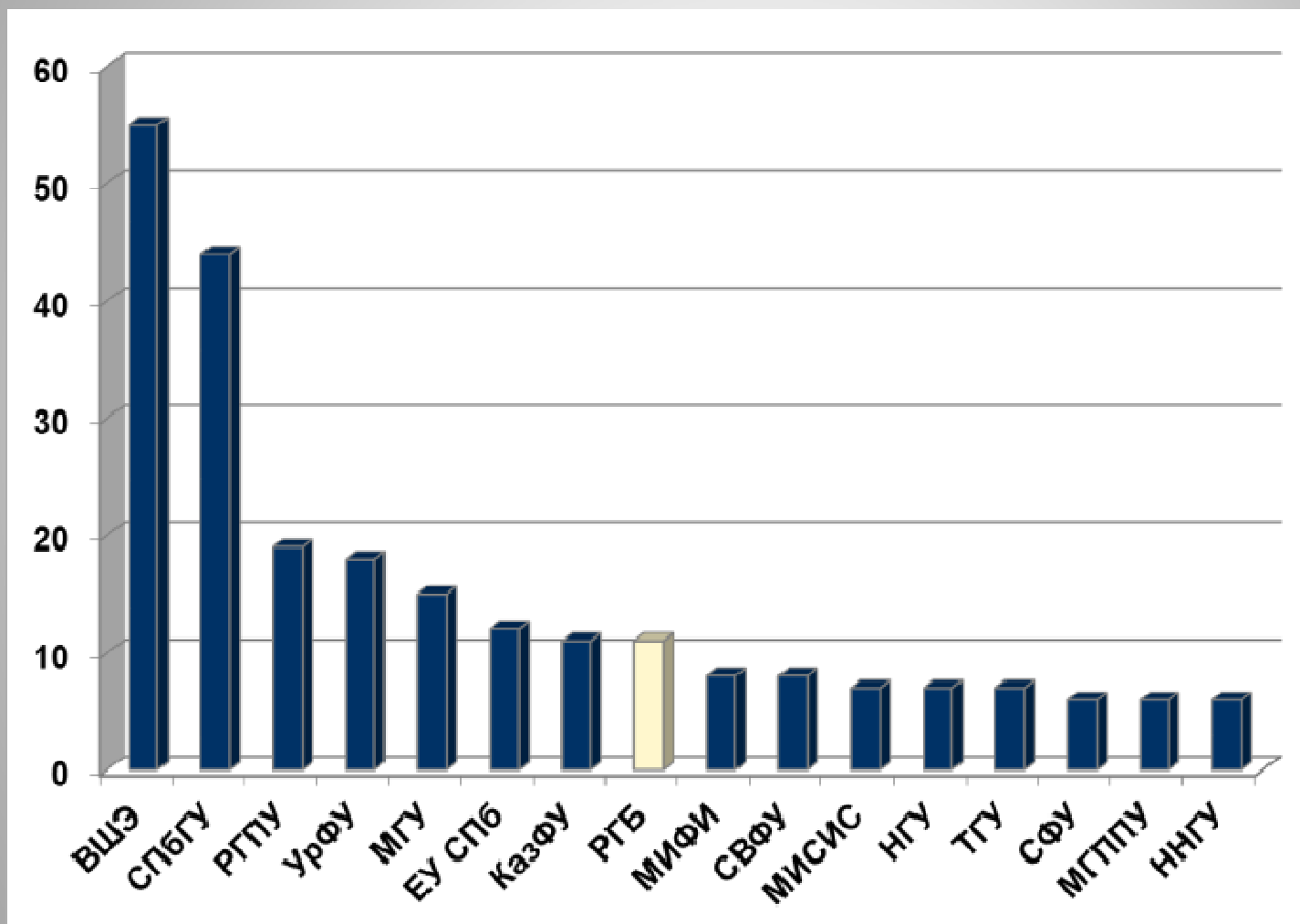
# Annual usage of world scholarly information by NEICON members, number of downloads



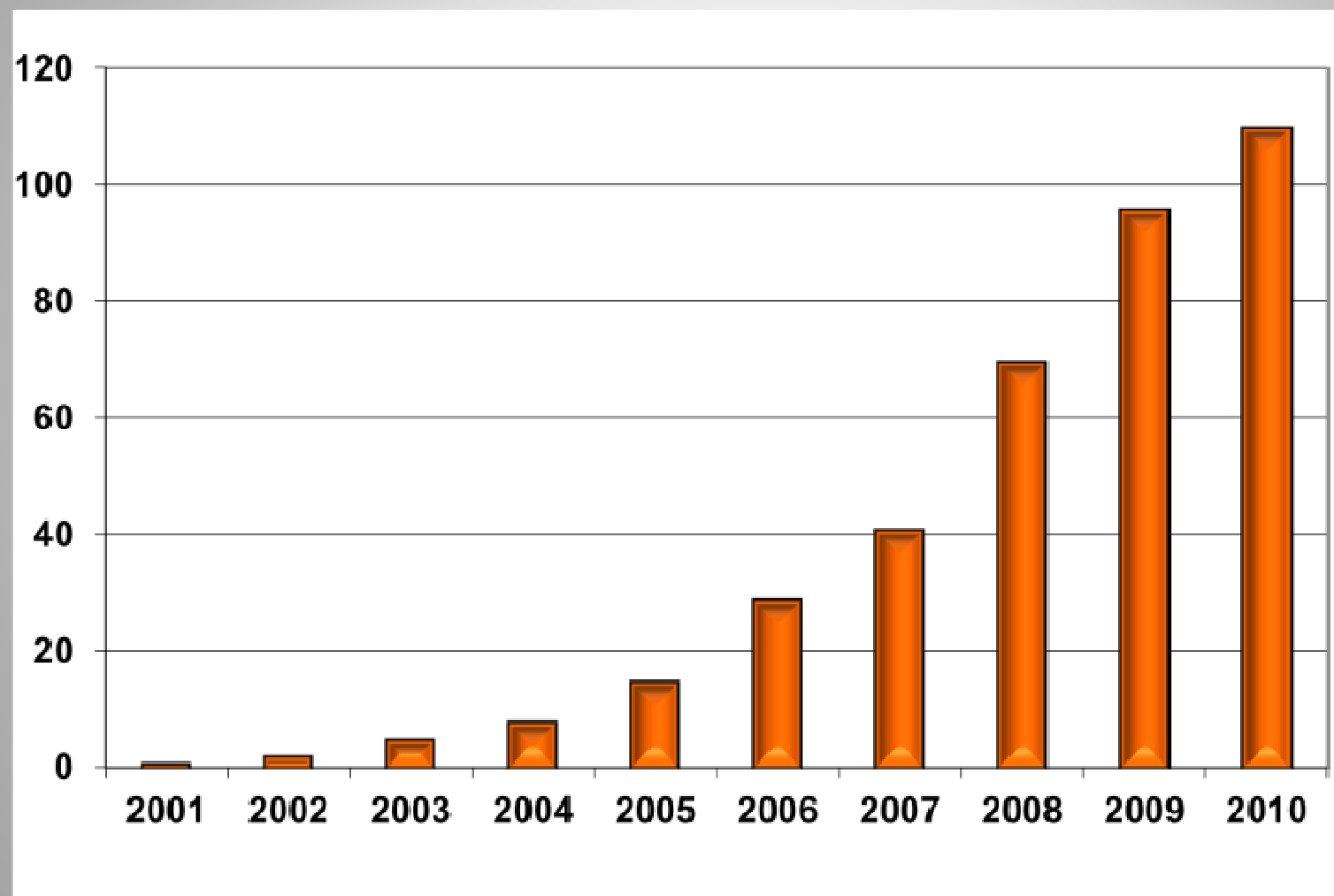
## What Russian libraries subscribe on their own

- ◉ Publishers: Number One – Elsevier (CUP, ACM, World Scientific).
- ◉ Aggregators: Number One– EBSCO Publishing. (JSTOR, Gale, Project Muse, LexisNexis)
- ◉ Citation indices: WoS, Scopus.
- ◉ E-Books: eBrary, Elsevier, NetLibrary, CUP, OUP, Muse+University Press, Books 24x7etc
- ◉ Dissertations–ProQuest.
- ◉ Dictionary and handbooks (Oxford, Elsevier, Palgrave, EB).
- ◉ Special databases (CAS, Reaxys, WorldBank, Euromonitor).
- ◉ Russian content – EastView, “University books”, Rubricon...
- ◉ And many others.DRM.

## Number of collections, 2011

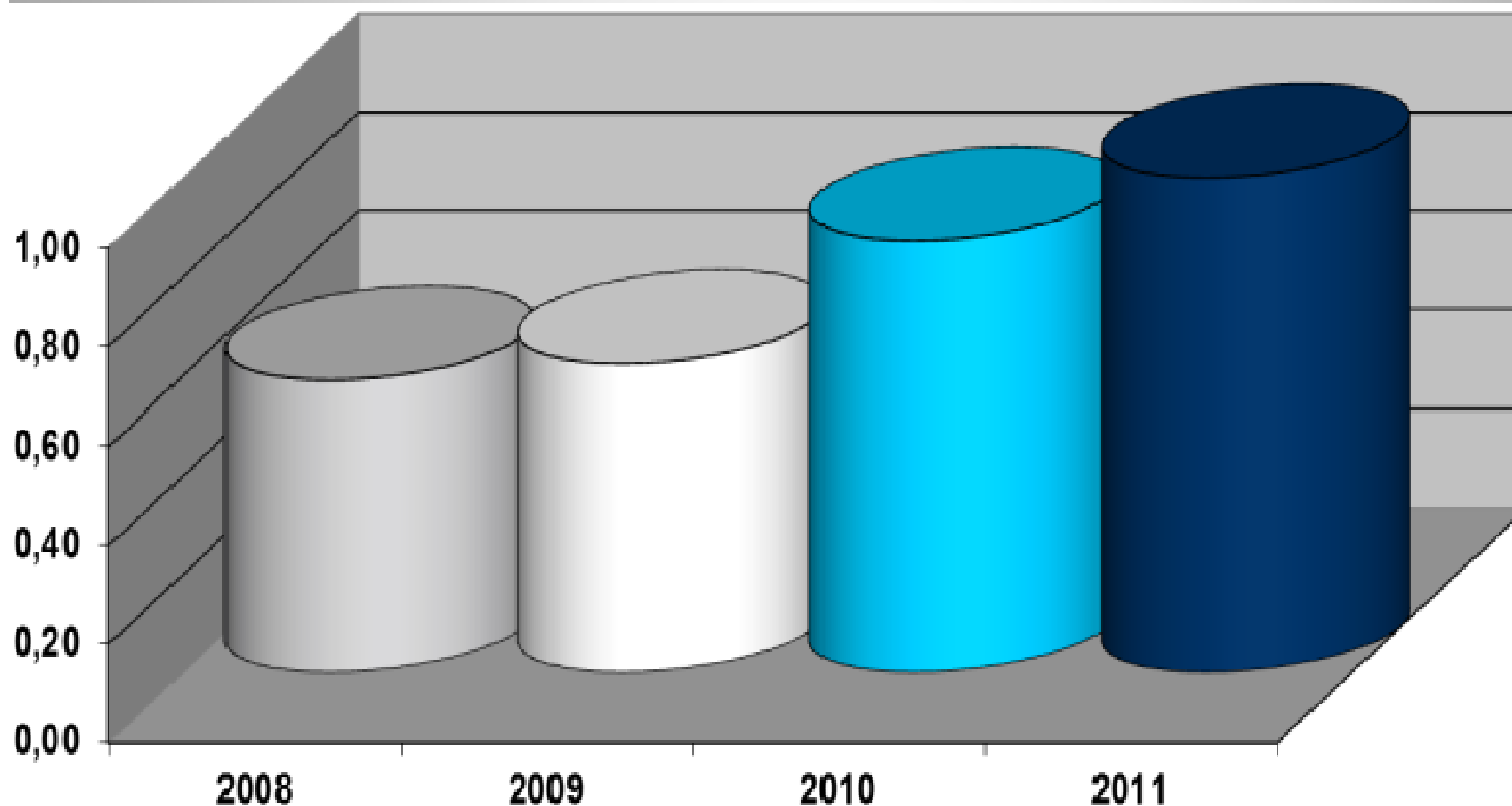


## Number of e-recourses in St Petersburg SU (2001 - 2010)



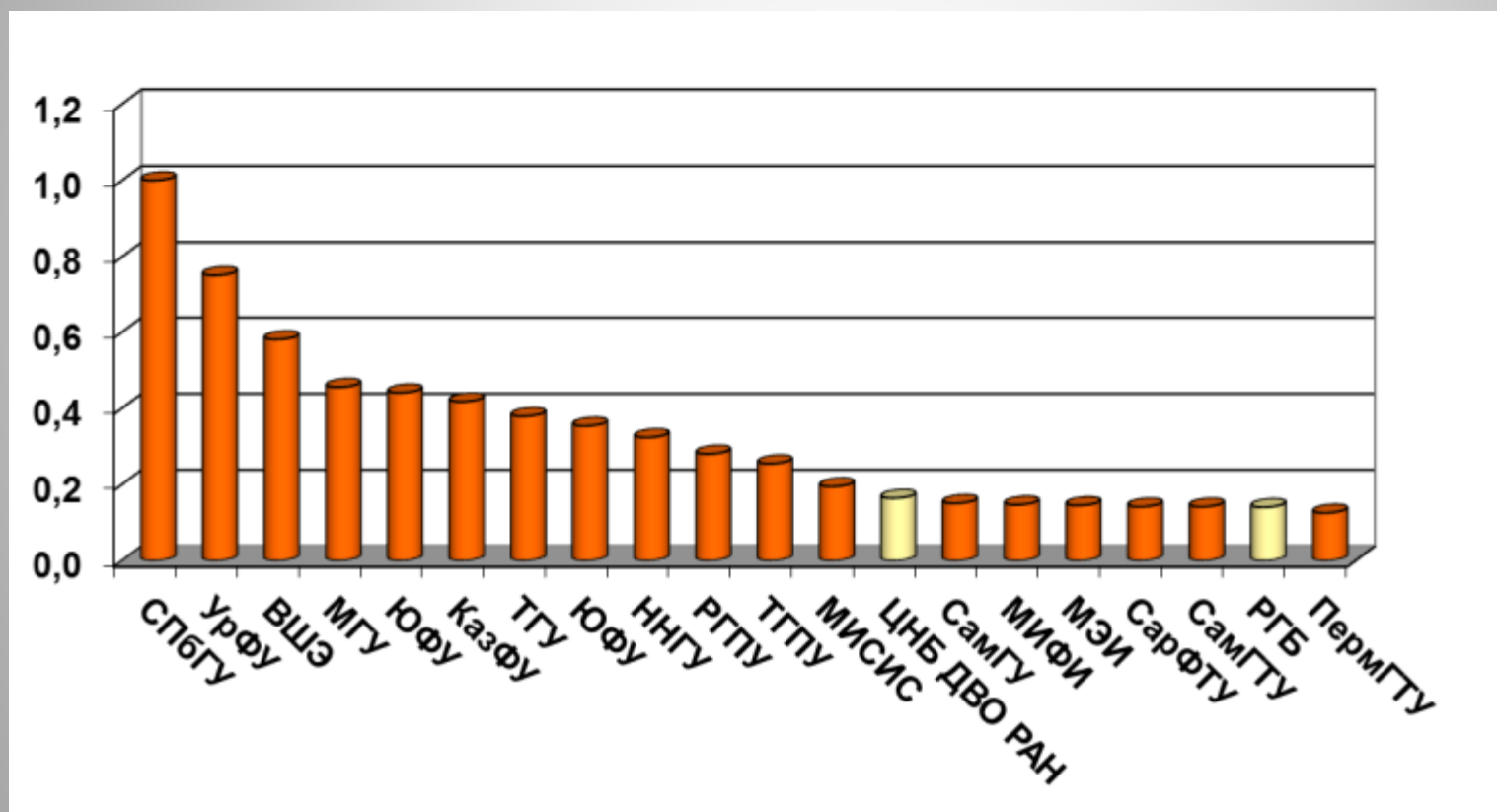
# Subscription with institutional funds

# American University

- ◉ Average budget of University is about 1-2 bln. USD
- ◉ Library gets 3-5% of budget – about 30-100 mln. USD
- ◉ 15-20% of library budget goes to electronic subscription (from 2 to 16 mln. USD).

## Russian University

- ◉ In 2010 a Russian University paid \$75 000 for electronic subscription and got 3,5 resources.
- ◉ General trends in Russia: overall acquisition budget is decreasing but the percentage of the budget spent for electronic subscription is increasing. For 39 leader universities both budgets are growing.
- ◉ However there are a few National Research Universities which spend nothing for electronic subscription.

## **New State contract with The Ministry of Education&Science in 2011-2013**

State contract with The Ministry of Education&Science requirement :

*Annual subscription fee will have been 100% covered from the institutional budgets by the end of the project (2013).*

## **New State contract with the Ministry of Education&Sciencein 2011-2013**

- ◉ Subscription to the journalsin thePriority Research Areas will be continued.
- ◉ Purchase of full archivesuponthe approved list of eight publishers (Science Online Archive (AAAS) 1880-1996has been already purchased).
- ◉ Access for all Academics and State Research Institutions.
- ◉ Access either on a Publisher or Russian Platform – development of a scholarly archive in the Russian Federation.

## Global trends

- ⦿ Migration to electronic resources
- ⦿ All major publishers started to publish electronic books along with journals.
- ⦿ Purchasing of archive collections on a national-wide basis.
- ⦿ Creating of own repositories along with international programs of “backup” archiving.
